On September 11, 1982 the Palmyra-Historical Society participated in its largest project of the year, when it hosted the Southeast Regional Convention of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin.

The convention was held at the Methodist Church and attended by persons interested in historical preservation from the south-eastern section of our state.

Three interesting sectional meetings were held providing information on preservation of heritage through use of video-tapes, methods of restoration, and membership & funding.

A delicious buffet luncheon was catered by the ladies of the Methodist Church, followed by three tours of different historical interest. One tour took visitors to the Calkins house to show how it has been restored to the splendor of an earlier year. Another had the Thomas Cabin as its destination showing the restoration of an early log cabin, and the third was a walking tour for observing historical landmarks of the village.
